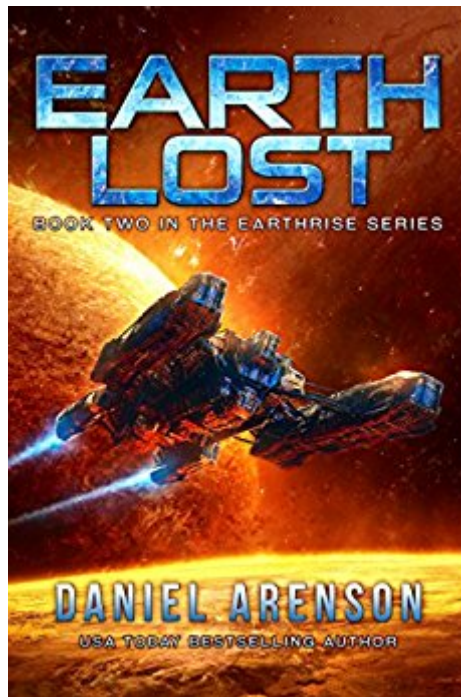

The Gist: Following on immediately from the events of book one, Marco, Addy and Co. Head towards the frontier to fight the scum in space, answering a distress call they land on a Azoth mining colony and find it deserted. What works: Well crafted, with cool action scenes full of gore and horrors, the author really captures the horrors of war and does so with heart. The characters are full of self doubt but want to do their duty and fight for humanity. What doesn't work: I'm having to be extremely picky to find fault in this book, there is a lot of similarities to well known sci fi movies, but

it's more an inspiration. Overall: An action filled Sci Fi thrill ride with heart and that is in essence what makes it so endearing, you care a lot about these characters, you laugh with them, you gasp with them and you tear up at the loss. But overall you cheer with them. Can't wait for book 3!

Overall I have some mixed feeling about this book. On the positive side: I stayed up well past my normal bed time to finish it so obviously I liked it... a lot. The deeper the team gets into the mine and the more complex Scum they come across the more this reminded me of spiritual warfare. The writers character development is excellent and you do get to feel you understand the motivation and feelings of the characters. But there are some surprises to keep it from being too predictable. He shows us characters with the best and worst traits in humans and sometimes in the same person. On the negative side: As I read I found the author did repeat himself often and some of the paragraphs I just quickly skimmed over because the information didn't seem relevant or important to the story line. A few general comments: That so few warriors could defeat so many of the Scum in in such restricted and confined spaces stretches plausibility. However, if I wanted plausibility I wouldn't read science fiction. In another review someone made a comment about swearing and indicated there was too much of it. I'm not a fan of gratuitous swearing but I am a combat veteran and I do recognize that among military personnel, especially in combat situations, swearing seems to be an occupational hazard. Even those who never swear outside of a military environment often revert to swearing and even more so when in or approaching combat. I'm looking forward to the next book in the series.

Book 2 was way more intense than book 1. Earth Alone introduced you to the characters, Earth Lost seriously showed you their strength! I was not expecting the saboteur to be who it was. Loved every moment of this story and can't wait for more!

I thoroughly enjoyed the first book and hoped that the second would be as enjoyable, and it was. Now I look forward to reading the third that I have already down loaded. Thanks Daniel Arenson.
