

I guess I wanted more out of each of our main characters. I wanted a satisfying conclusion for all of them. Now, if you've stuck with me this far you might think that I didn't like the series. Quite the opposite actually. This is one of my favorite character series. I feel like I know each of the characters. I'm invested in their future and their growth. I'm sorry to see it end. Just enough suspense, romance, and violence spread throughout. You know what's happening without being told in graphic detail what's happening and that's a gift. A sign of a very talented writer. If you haven't read this series, you should read it. You might feel a little let down by the end, but overall it's a good read.

This is the last of the Lizzy Gardner series, and unfortunately the only one I haven't given 5 stars, so I did really enjoy the series but I thought this was a weak ending. What I did like about the book were that it depicted a buzzing PI firm filled with interesting and complex women. It was great to have all the characters, including Jessica, on hand for this last volume. I also liked that the business was hopping -- lots of little interesting cases and one big one. What I didn't like was the sloppy dialogue, usually so sharp, and the lazy writing, usually so fine. I felt the author was tired of this series and just wanted to wrap it up. Each character's ending was a bit trite and superficial. This is just my opinion. Obviously a lot of people liked it fine, and I would recommend the series.

I was given an ARC of Evil Never Dies from NetGalley for an honest review so this is the review. It is hard to believe that this is the end of the Lizzy Gardner series by T.R. Ragan. I was hooked from the first book and I am still hooked now and I don't want to let this set of characters go because I have grown to love them so much because they have all grown so much throughout this series it is hard to see them go unless Ms. Ragan has a change of heart or does something with one of the other characters these girls will be greatly missed in mystery fiction. Now for this book it was the perfect send off for Lizzy. The plot was well written and everyone had a huge role in the story so we got to see a lot of Hayley, Kitally, Jessica, Tommy and even Jared who passed away had a role in this book so that was cool. I loved how everything came together but how it was left so Ragan can come back to the series if she wishes. I am not going to give spoilers so there is not a lot I can say about the plot and what happens to our beloved characters but I will say if you are a Lizzy Gardner fan this is a

must read. Needless to say this is five out of five stars.

I couldn't put this one down, I read it in a few hours. Though it was a fitting ending for the characters I have grown to love, or at least tolerate (Hayley), I'm torn about it being over. This series has been one of my favorites. But the last two books have been darker (for Lizzy), and I miss the Lizzy/Jared dynamic that was present in the earlier books. Like with the previous books, T.R. Ragan creates compelling villains, and I felt a great deal of satisfaction at how their storylines ended. The pacing was quick, the book never dragged. I loved the relationship between Lizzy, Hayley and Kitally. Jessica made an appearance as well, but she was sort of on the other side of the vigilante trio. The rational part of me doesn't agree with working outside the law to bring evil people to justice, but the emotional side of me can see the appeal. It's clear that Lizzy struggles with the same thoughts.

Final book in the series and I absolutely loved it. I felt it was very fast paced and finished the book in a day, with taking very few breaks. Lizzy Gardner is a powerful character, who in some sense has become broken since her finance's death. The story is powerful, emotional and I will admit that when Lizzy is talking to her therapist, I had a few tears. T.R. Ragan is an outstanding author and this series has kept me hooked, I can't wait to read more from this author.

All of the Lizzy Gardner books have been great. I get to reading and don't want to do anything else. Ms Ragan has created a scary, absorbing story. Multiple bad guys, good girls, cops and family members. I'm sure her future books will be written with the same intrigue. You go girl. Happy Reading!
